Master of Ceremonies

Steven Robertson is a retired high school band director of 44 years! Notably, he opened Skyview High School in 1996 and taught there until retirement producing some great jazz bands

As a retiree he works part time at Music World Stores where he visits schools and helps band directors as the school rep.

Steve plays in several ensembles currently including Salsanova (salsa band), Van Port Jazz band, Clark College Jazz band, Solid Brass Pdx (brass band) and the Jewish Community Orchestra. He can often be found subbing in many other music groups locally.



Adjudicators

Tristan Weitkamp is currently Interim Director of Bands and Visiting Instructor of music at Portland State University. He holds a bachelor's degree in Jazz Performance, a master's degree in Instrumental Conducting, and a master's degree in Education from PSU. Following his undergraduate degree he also completed post-bac studies at the University of Cape Town in South Africa.

Starting in 2015 Tristan taught jazz ensembles, marching ensembles, and concert ensembles at high schools across the Beaverton, Tigard, and Sherwood school districts. In 2016 Tristan founded a smallgroup jazz academy within the Beaverton School District which encompassed seven jazz combos across three of the district's high schools. In 2020 Tristan returned to Portland State to study instrumental conducting with Patrick Vandehey and consecutively complete a master's degree in education.



Ryan Meagher (pronounced Marr) is a jazz guitarist and composer who grew up in San Jose, California. Perhaps best-known for his compositional acumen, he is also well-known for his flexibility and range. He is truly in his own space when exploring his thoughtprovoking original material with exciting and sensitive sidemen, but he has also accompanied a pool of incredibly diverse artists. He can lay down traditional harmonic and rhythmic framework for artists like Terell Stafford and Randy Brecker, and John Clayton. But he can also stretch and provide color like he has alongside very adventurous artists like trumpeters Cuong Vu and Taylor Ho Bynum, bassist David Friesen, and the poll-winning ensemble Mostly Other People Do the Killing.

It was during the period that he lived in New York City when launched his debut album Sun Resounding announcing his arrival on the modern jazz scene. Shortly after the success of his second album entitled Atroefy on Fresh Sound New Talent Records he attended the University of Nevada, Reno (UNR) to attain his master of music degree in pursuit of a career in jazz education. His third album Tone was recorded in NYC in between his studies at UNR and it received international critical acclaim. After the completion of his master of music degree Meagher relocated to Portland, Oregon where he quickly became a recognizable force in the creative music community there. Along with releasing his fourth record Tango In the City of Roses on PJCE Records he has been instrumental in expanding the scene. He has been working closely with the Portland Jazz Composers Ensemble since 2013 and is now the organization's Artistic Director. He is also a co-founder and the Programming Director of the Montavilla Jazz Festival. He was previously Editor of the Jazzscene Magazine, and currently teaches at Mt Hood Community College, University of Portland and directs the jazz program at Lower Columbia College in Longview, WA. He has a total of eight albums as a leader, has been a sideman on many more, and is set to release a multidisciplinary work with a visual artist in May of 2023.

Adjudicators

David Duarte (sight reading judge)

Corey Foster was born and raised in Portland, Oregon. He began playing snare drum at five years old, and Drum set by 8. Foster graduated Cum Laude from Berklee College of Music in the Fall of 2014.

Foster's recording and performing career took off immediately working with producer Alexis Rodriguez (Silver Gun Records), The Symptoms, and other Boston area bands. Foster was played with countless local Portland acts and released his first album, Taking Root, with his new band the Corey Foster Collective.

Soon after its release, Foster got the call to join the nationally touring Reggae Fusion band Indubius. Foster toured the country with Indubious, opened for all of the Marley's, Steel Pulse, and played major festivals like Kaya Fest, Shangri-La, Pyro Fest, and many others. Foster Recorded and engineered the drum sessions for two of the Indubious albums, From Zero and Beleaf. Both hit the top of the Billboard Music Reggae charts. (From Zero #3, and Beleaf #1).

Since 2019, Foster has continued to record for local artists, and for several artists in LA on the Silver Gun Records label. His private lesson studio is a drumming home to 30+ diligent students per week.

In the summer of 2022, Foster started Rooted Rhythm - a small business with an online store, and offering private lessons and recording services.

Don Norton is an Assistant Professor of Music and Director of Jazz Studies at the University of Portland. As a saxophonist and woodwind artist, he has performed throughout the United States and abroad in a variety of styles that include jazz, classical, world music, and musical theater. He also serves as a clinician with the Vandoren Artist-Clinician Program and has presented at conferences of the Jazz Education Network, the North American Saxophone Alliance, and the Oregon Music Education Association. He holds degrees from the University of Northern Colorado, the New England Conservatory of Music, and Northern Illinois University.

The music of Jay Si Proof (JSP) is a collaboration of musicians, sounds, and influences designed and curated by multidimensional artist and visionary Jeff Chilton (aka Jay Si) fronting the project on vocals and the trombone. Chilton's credits include performing with The Diamonds, The Platters, Broken Social Scene, Branford Marsalis, Le Beouf Brothers, Terell Stafford and recording on over 20 albums by Portland based ensembles. Described as "earth jazz alchemists" by Vortex Magazine, JSP was born in 2019 from the soggy jazz soaked earth of Portland, OR, and, since its inception, has evolved through adventurous jazz fusion, to indie low-fi jams, to a full fledged funk party, all while prioritizing genuine and uplifting messages of spirituality and human betterment.

JSP has performed their unique sound across the Pacific Northwest, elevating crowds in Seattle, Bend, Eugene, Rogue Valley, San Francisco, Santa Cruz and more. They have performed at venues such as Portland's Goodfoot, Seattle's Nectar, and Berkeley's Back Room, growing a passionate grassroots following. The band is known for their energetic performances, crowd engagement and involvement.

JSP released their "Closer" EP in Spring of 2021 to praise and attention at home on Portland's KMHD Jazz Radio as well as abroad in Europe and South American playlists. Their music video for "Our Lament" was featured in Portland's Vortex Music Magazine. Their upcoming 12 track album "Care About It" sees the band flexing their arranging aesthetics referencing influences from Earth, Wind, and Fire to Moonchild.

Participation in the ensemble is by audition and jazz improvisation skills are not mandatory, but highly encouraged. Throughout the year, students are guided through an active learning curriculum on correct performance techniques of different jazz styles and concert repertoire. Additionally, students are exposed to a wide variety of jazz-related subjects from jazz improvisation and history to understanding Latin/Afro-Cuban jazz rhythm. Above all, teamwork and leadership are a focused learning outcome. The Jazz Ensemble has performed internationally and received critical acclaim at many prestigious jazz festivals throughout the United States and Mexico where our students received numerous recognitions for outstanding musicianship. We are also proud that many of our students desiring to go on to four-year music programs have successfully transitioned to Jazz Studies programs such as University of Northern Colorado, University of Idaho, Washington State University, Central Washington University, and the University of North Texas
